Autism Diagnostic Observation Schedule-2nd Edition (ADOS-2): If the ADOS-2 is clinically indicated for diagnostic purposes, it requires an additional in person visit: \$400

Classroom observation: Our developmental psychologist can observe your child in their classroom upon request: \$400 + travel time at \$10 for every 10 minutes each way from our office.

FAQs

What does a Developmental-Behavioral Pediatrician do?

A developmental-behavioral pediatrician is a medical doctor (MD or DO) who specializes in diagnosing and treating children with developmental, learning, or behavioral problems. They have completed four years of medical school, three years of residency training in pediatrics, board certification in pediatrics, and additional subspecialty training in developmental-behavioral pediatrics. This allows them to take detailed medical and psychosocial histories, perform medical examinations, and engage in interactive assessments to identify subtle developmental issues.

What does a Developmental Psychologist do?

A developmental psychologist is a licensed clinical psychologist (Ph.D. or Psy.D.) who specializes in child development. They perform validated tests to objectively assess multiple developmental domains which include cognitive skills as well as verbal and visual skills. During the standardized testing, the psychologist observes the child's social and emotional functioning. They also interview parents and seek feedback from teachers to learn more about your child's unique symptom profile, which helps them decide what tests will be given.

Can I see both providers?

Dr. Singh works with children under the age of 3, and Dr. Miodovnik works with children 4 and up. In the event that you would need testing that your initial practitioner is unable to provide, the office will coordinate this additional evaluation.

What is the Autism Diagnostic Observation Schedule (ADOS)?

The Autism Diagnostic Observation Schedule (ADOS) is a standardized diagnostic test for assessing autism spectrum disorder. It uses a protocol that involves a series of structured and semi-structured interactive tasks, which allow the examiner to observe the child's social, communication, and play skills.

Who is allowed to attend the appointments?

No more than two adults are allowed to accompany the child. Additionally, only the child being seen is allowed to attend the appointment. Siblings or other children are not allowed.

Can I request a specific test without requiring a full evaluation?

We believe that comprehensive assessments are the only way to identify important and relevant findings that may otherwise be missed by using a single test. Therefore, we do not accommodate requests for specific tests and all new patients must undergo a full initial evaluation.

Do Dr. Miodovnik or Dr. Singh take insurance?

Dr. Miodovnik and Dr. Singh are currently not in network with any insurance carriers. By operating out of network, they can focus more on meeting the individual needs of each family - an approach to medicine that can no longer be achieved in traditional healthcare settings due to reduced insurance reimbursements, limited clinician autonomy, and burdensome administrative tasks. Upon request, our office can provide a superbill for in person time only. You can then submit this directly to your insurance company. Please be aware that some of the services provided may not be covered by your medical insurance plan.

Is a payment plan an option?

Payment plans are an option that can be worked out with our office at the time of scheduling.
